- R. 13 (11), (15) & (16) – sufficiency of financial disclosure and duties associated with production of it
- R. 14-rule changes re service and confirmation of motions
- R. 15 – motions to change
- R. 17-rule changes regarding case conference briefs and confirmation of case conferences;
- R. 17 (14.2) – documents to be brought to settlement conferences
- R. 19 (1), (2), (6.1) and (11) – affidavits of documents and requests for third party disclosure
- R. 20 (3) – third party questioning in child protection proceedings; reading in questioning transcript evidence at trial
- R. 22 (1) – requests to admit; what does genuine mean?
- R. 24 – changes to costs requests, including reasonableness and proportionality
